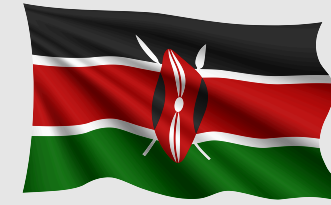

To build a network of legal professionals devoted to using the law as a tool for positive societal change and advancement.

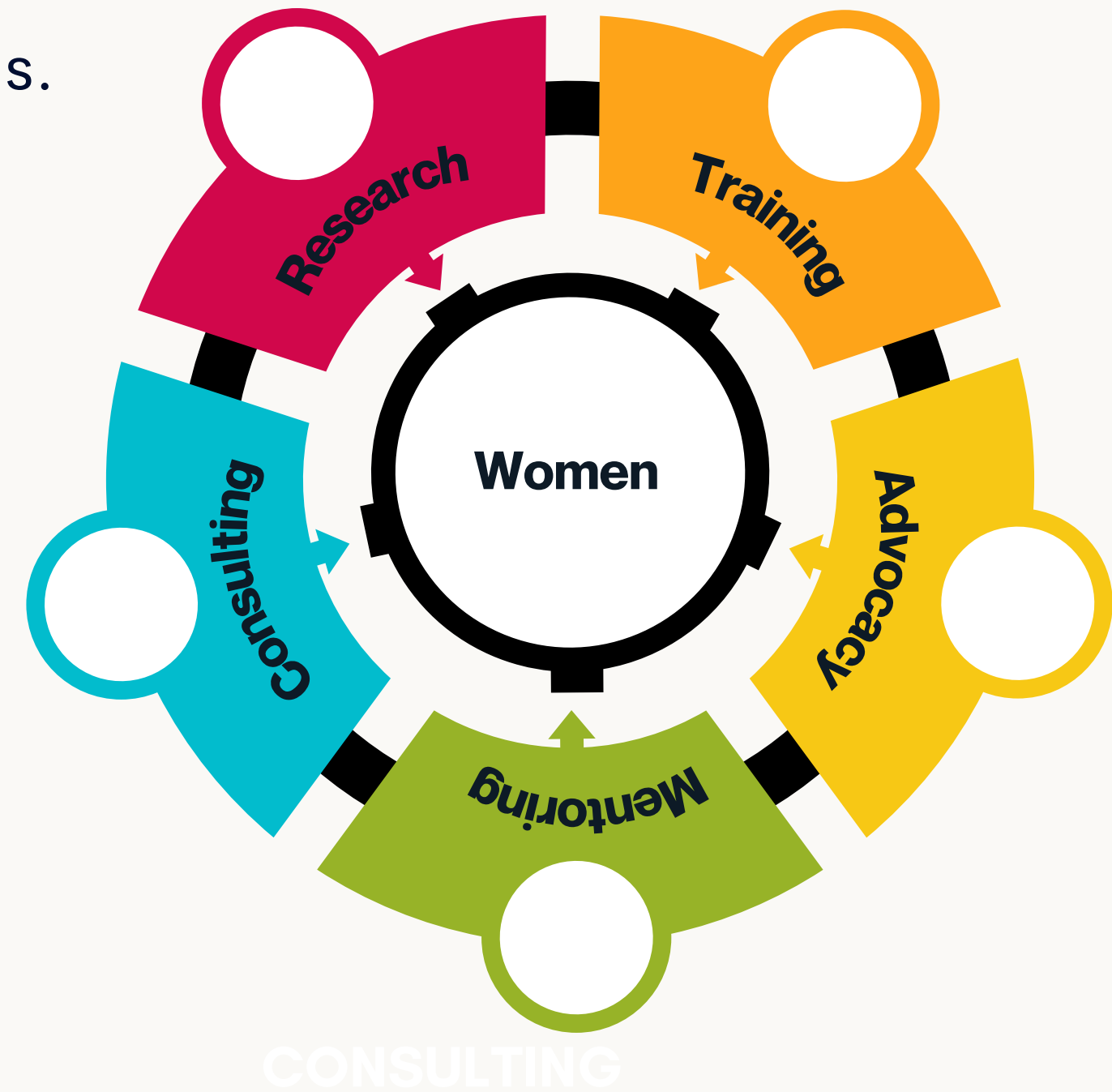

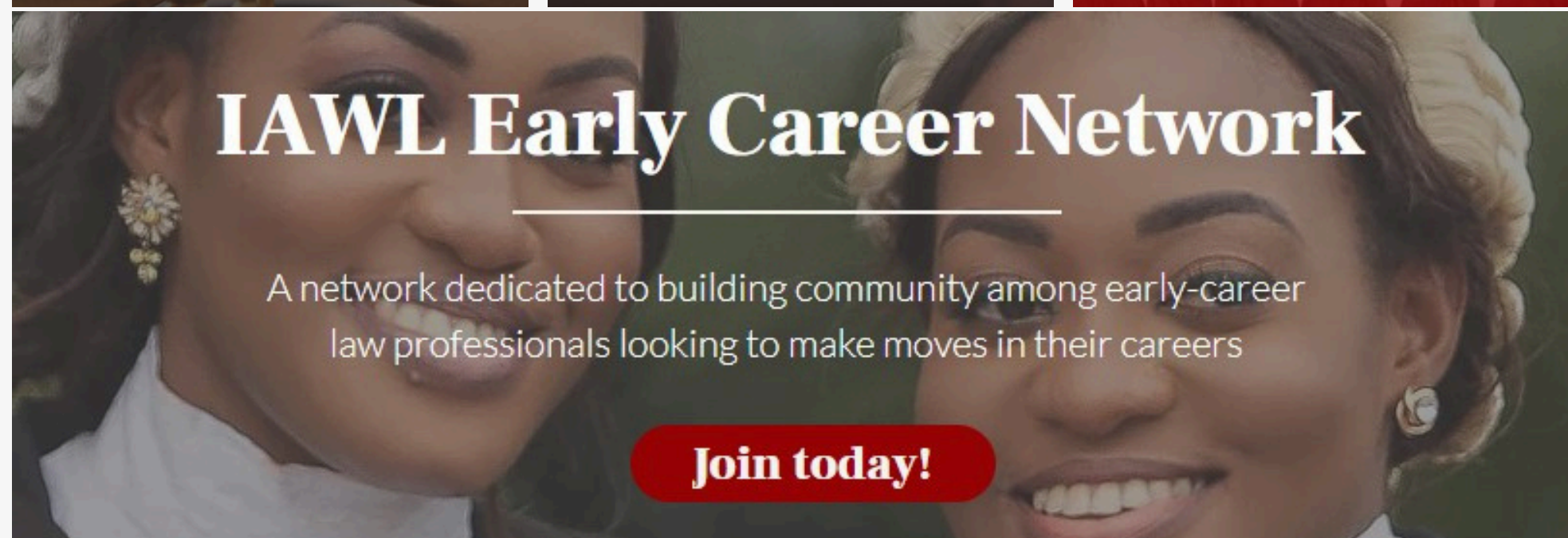

A digital training initiative to train and develop the capacity of 500,000+ women for leadership and professional development in the next five years.

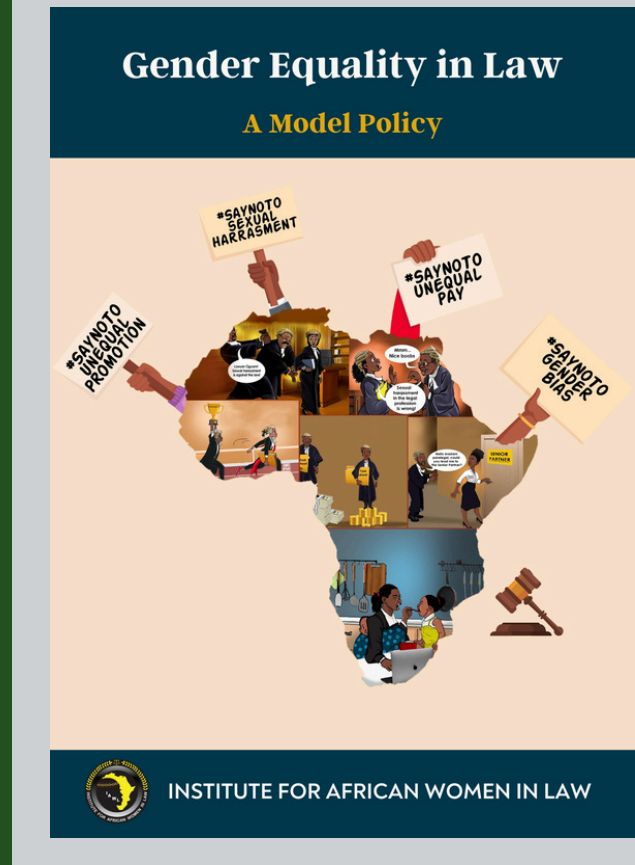
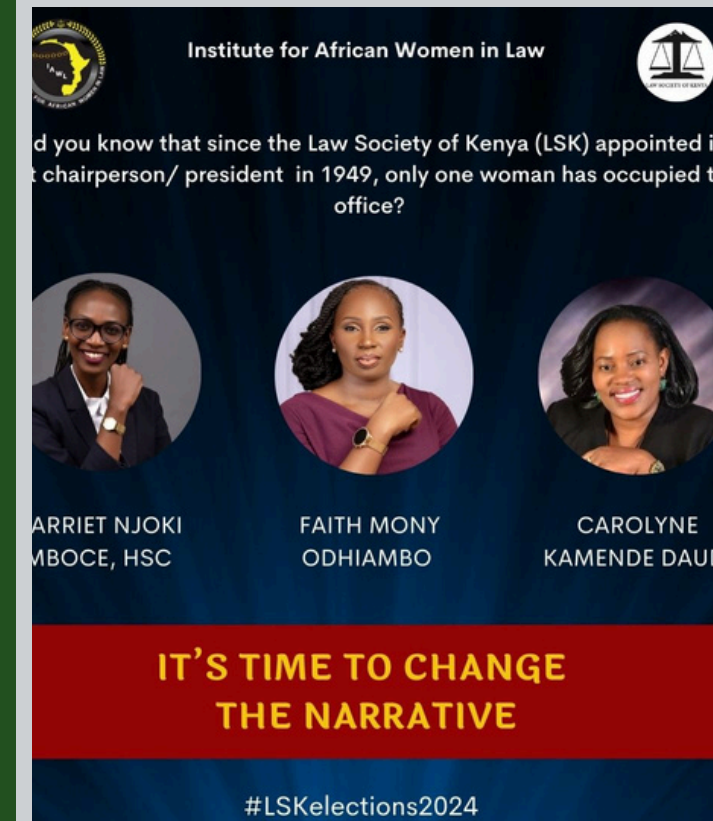
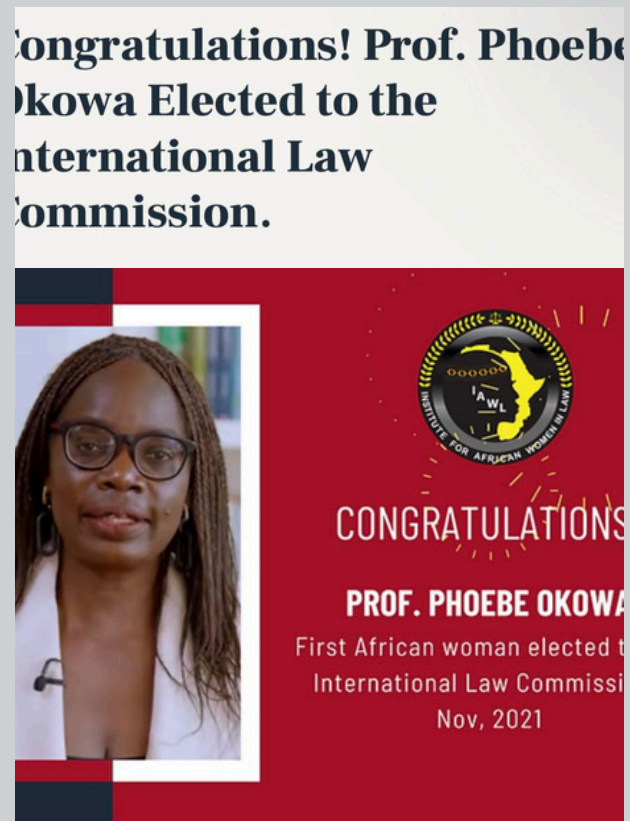

- Launched the Gender Equality in Law Campaign (GELC) to effect policy and practice reforms for equitable and women-inclusive institutional practices and policies.

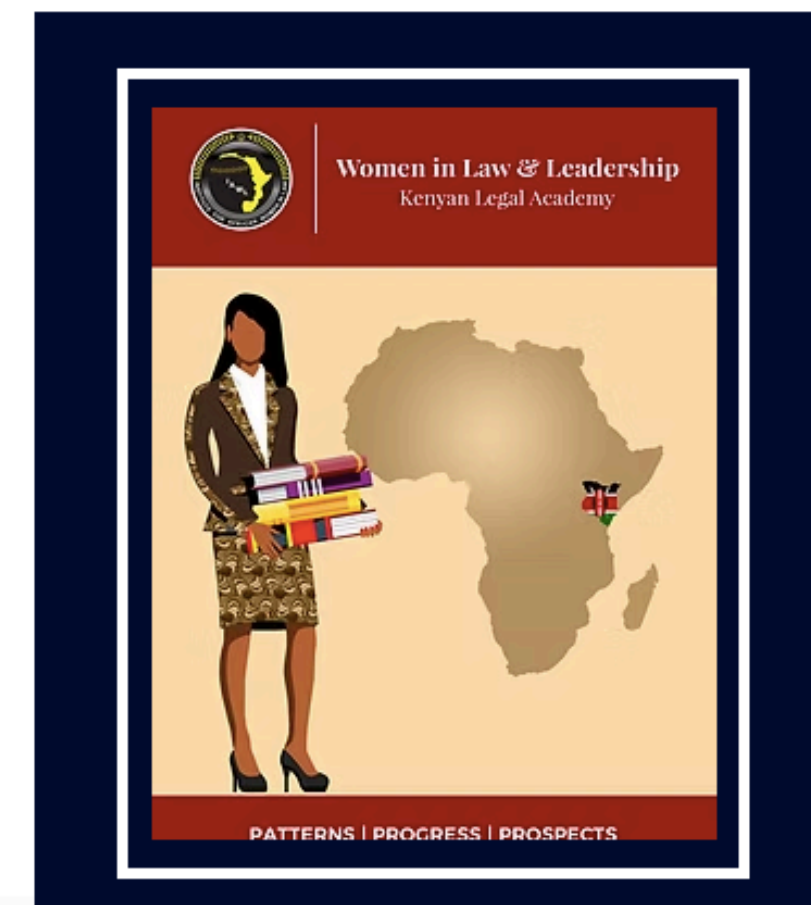
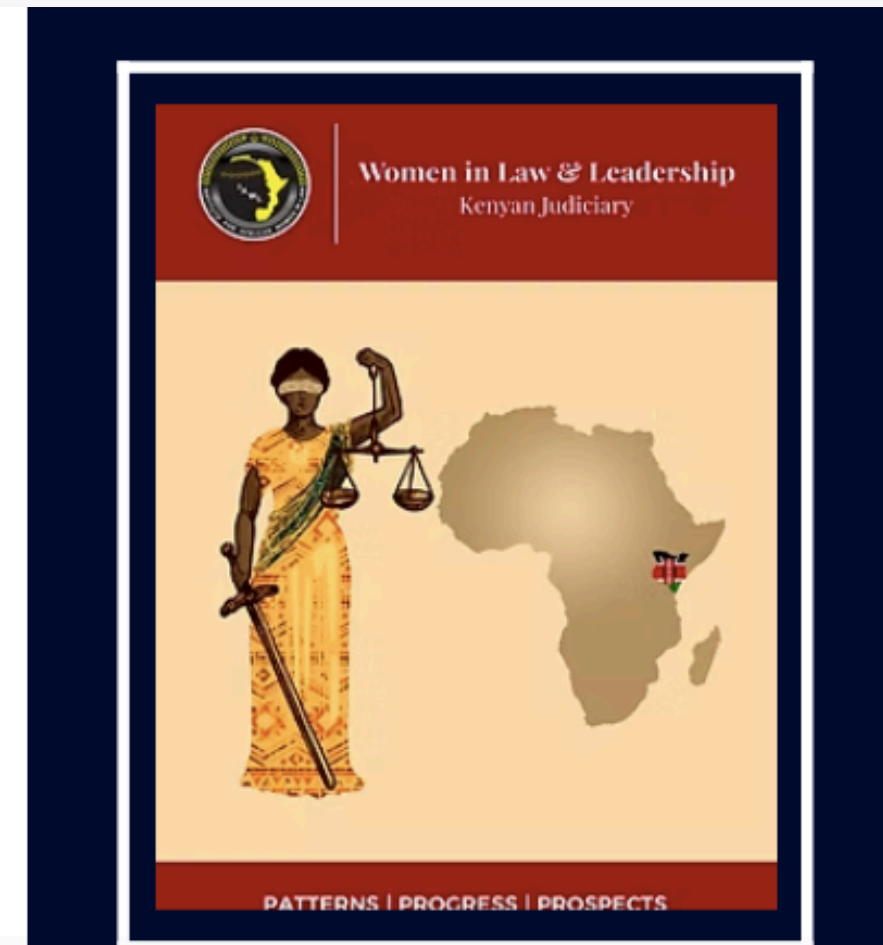
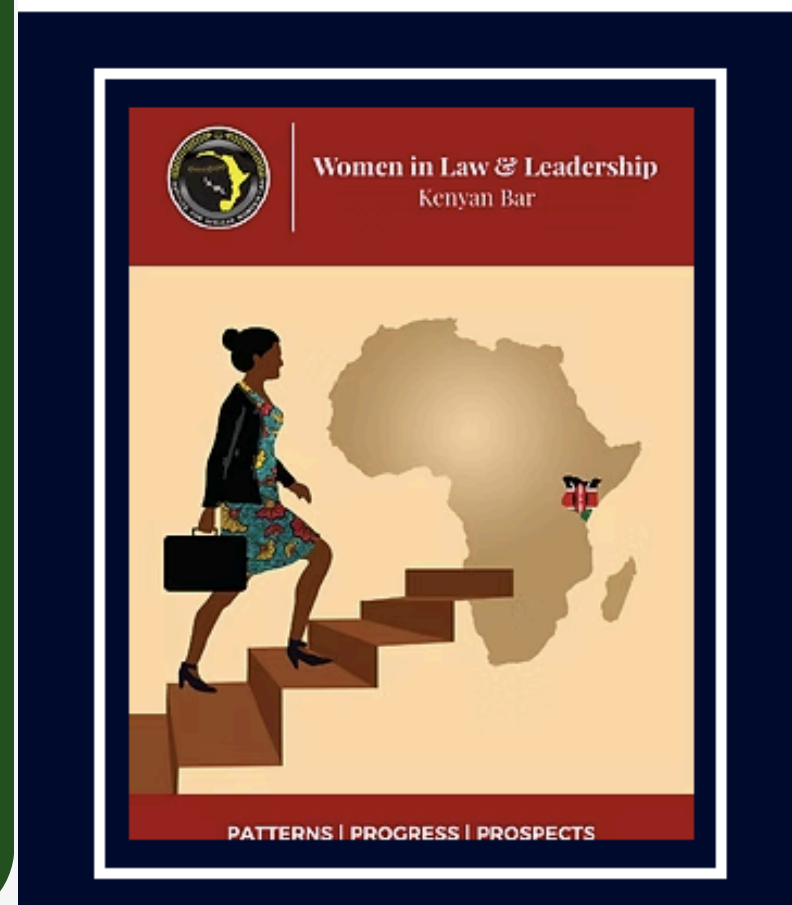


What we do
